The 7th Biennial Michigan Celebration of Women in Computing (MICWIC 2019) will be held on the Grand Valley State University campus this spring. On Friday, March 29 and Saturday, March 30, students, faculty, and professionals with interests in advancing the fields of computing and information technology through broadening diversity will convene for presentations, panel discussions, a poster session, and career exploration. A Career Fair on March 30 will feature both regional and national companies and many Michigan colleges and universities.

We invite you to help shape the MICWIC 2019 program through submission to one or more of our tracks for professional engagement. Organizers welcome submission of Papers and Posters from students, and of Lightning Talks and Birds-of-Feather (BOF) sessions from everyone on any topic related to computer science or information technology, including education, societal and ethical issues and professional development.

Submissions will be lightly reviewed for content and suitability. MICWIC does not produce a proceedings; presenting a paper or poster at MICWIC does not preclude later publication of the work in an archival venue.

Top student submissions will be awarded scholarships of up to \$1000 toward costs to attend the 2019 Grace Hopper Celebration of Women in Computing or another relevant professional conference.
